Q&A 46 What do you mean by saying, "He ascended into Heaven"?

That Christ, while His disciples watched, was lifted up from the earth into heaven and will be there for our good until He comes again to judge the living and the dead.

Q&A 47 But isn't Christ with us until the end of the world as He promised us?

Christ is true man and true God. In His human nature Christ is not now on earth; but in His divinity, majesty, grace, and Spirit He is not absent from us for a moment.

<u>Q&A 48 If His humanity is not present wherever His divinity is, then aren't the two natures of Christ separated from each other?</u>

Certainly not. Christ's divinity is surely beyond the bounds of the humanity He has taken on, But remains personally united to His humanity.

Q&A 49 How does Christ's ascension into heaven benefit us?

First, He pleads our cause in heaven in the presence of His Father.

Third, He sends His Spirit to us on earth as a further guarantee. By the Spirit's power we make the goal of our lives, the things above.

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
