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Questions for the Week

1. Why was Paul willing to engage in "no small dissension and debate" (Acts 15:2) rather than simply agree to disagree? What does this teach us about the importance of the doctrine of salvation? How can we distinguish between doctrines worth defending and secondary issues where Christians may disagree?
2. Peter insists that both Jews and Gentiles are saved "through the grace of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 15:11). Why is it so tempting to add something to the gospel, whether good works, religious performance, moral achievement, or personal effort? In what ways might Christians today subtly rely on something other than Christ for their assurance before God?
3. Peter describes the Law as a "yoke" that neither Israel nor their fathers could bear (Acts 15:10). What are some burdens that Christians today place upon themselves that Christ has not required? How can we better rest in the finished work of Christ rather than striving to earn God's favor?
4. The Jerusalem Council pursued unity, but not at the expense of truth. Why is unity often viewed as the highest virtue in the church today? What dangers arise when churches prioritize unity, acceptance, or cultural relevance above biblical faithfulness?
5. How can Christians demonstrate genuine love and compassion while remaining faithful to God's Word?
6. In your own life, where do you feel the greatest pressure to soften or remain silent about biblical truth? How can you stand with both conviction and humility in those situations? What would faithful witness look like this week?

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
