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Questions for the Week

1. Apollos was “competent in the Scriptures” and “fervent in spirit,” yet he still needed to be taught “the way of God more accurately” (Acts 18:24-26). Are you willing to admit that there are areas where you still need to grow? What are you doing to pursue the command of 2 Peter 3:18 to “grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ”?
2. Apollos could have allowed his education, eloquence, and knowledge of Scripture to make him resistant to Priscilla and Aquila. Instead, he listened and continued in ministry. When Scripture exposes something in your life, or another believer lovingly points out an area where you need to grow, how do you respond?
3. Paul repeatedly used opportunities to reason from the Scriptures and proclaim Christ (Acts 18:19, 28). Who are the people God has placed in your life who may not yet know Jesus as Savior and Lord? Have you become indifferent to their spiritual condition? What would it look like for you to pray for them, develop genuine relationships with them, and be ready to speak about Christ when God provides an opportunity?
4. Paul himself said, “Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on” (Philippians 3:12). Where is God currently calling you to grow? If God is not finished with me yet, what is He presently teaching me?
